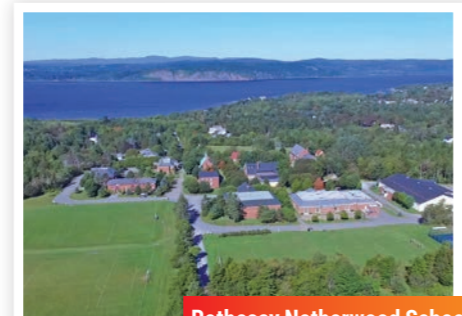

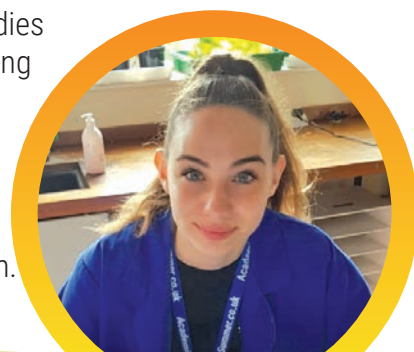

Get Ready for Computer Science – age 15+
